George Krienke thanked the staff from Regions Hospital that performed health testing on our members prior to the meeting today. George introduced the speaker for the day who is the Chief Epidemiologist for the State of Minnesota, Jayne Griffith.

Jayne's topic was the H1N1 strain of influenza that began about a year ago in our country and the world! It is spread by aerosolized droplets from sneezing and coughing and it affects birds, swine and humans. She talked about the definition of Pandemic as being a new strain of a disease so there is no immunity in the population. It is unpredictable as to when it will happen and it comes in waves due to the life cycle of the disease. Tracking this disease would have been a statistical person's delight. The statistics and patterns that were tracked were plentiful and helped develop patterns and predictability of the expansion of the disease.



Some of the specific points that were interesting were:

- School closings don't work in this case
- At the State Fair, Swine caught the flu from Humans
- Nationally there were about 12,000 deaths and 47,000 infected by the H1N1 Virus.
- Pregnant women are more susceptible than others
- Morbidly obese people had bad outcomes with H1N1.
- In Canada Native Populations were more susceptible
- In the USA Blacks, Asians and Hispanics were more susceptible
- People with Asthma were more susceptible.
