Our speaker was Sister Rosita Aranita, CSJ. She is one of the Sisters of Saint Joseph. She gave a very interesting talk on water problems in Kenya, Africa. She describes the present situation in Kenya without water projects. People spend a large part of their time looking for water. When they find it, the women carry it to their homes in five gallon pails. Historically, there has been some effort in the past to provide wells for Kenya, but they have generally failed because they did not involve active participation from the local community and no one in local communities had the ability to

provide maintenance. Sister Rosita's organization encourages local participation. That way the maintenance of the water projects is much easier with the knowledge of the local population.

Some of the problems of lack of water in Kenya are due to extremely dry conditions. The rain season is from April to June but the rest of the year they experience almost drought-like conditions.

The largest lake in Africa lies in Kenya, and that is Lake Victoria. Lake Victoria is a large lake, approaching the size of some of our great lakes in this country. The lake has a shoreline up to three thousand miles long. Despite the size of Lake Victoria, it is of very little use to water projects in Africa as it is highly polluted and in some places even dangerous to wade in.

Sister Rosita's project is to drill wells and they have to be relatively deep—about 60 meters or almost 180 feet. And then, of course, once the well is drilled, it's necessary to connect the well to where the water is used in homes and so forth.

Besides the water shortage, Kenya has extreme health conditions and a terrible problem with diseases such as H.I.V. This has caused a tremendous loss of life and a huge number of orphans. All of Sister Rosita's topics were interesting and she certainly held the interest of the Rotary Club.

President Art presented Sister Rosita with our Four Way Test coin and a promise to continue planting trees in Central Park, our tradition of thanking speakers for their time.

## Global Grant Scholarship 2011-12 and Peace Scholarship 2011-13 Opportunity knocks . . . Spread the word!

District 5960 has been selected as a "Future Vision Pilot" District for Rotary International. This exciting opportunity to test the waters in some new areas and help Rotary focus its efforts means that some of our programs will change. Beginning in 2010, our District will not be offering Rotary Ambassadorial Scholarships. Instead, we will offer a Global Grant Scholarship.

### **The Global Grant Scholarship Fall 2011/Winter 2012**

Applications will be available in April 2010; District interviews will take place in Fall 2010 and international processing of the applications will take place in Spring 2011

Global grants must relate to one or more of the six areas of

Rotary focus and have a long-term impact

Peace and conflict prevention/resolution

Disease prevention and treatment

Water and sanitation

Maternal and child health

Basic education and literacy

Economic and community development

Global grants must be sustainable and measurable (How will the scholar's studies support one or more of the areas of focus?); A global grant's minimum financing is \$30,000

Scholarship funds studies for a term or one to four academic years,

Scholarship funds may be used for tuition, room and board, books, travel expenses, visas, inoculations, as well as any humanitarian projects the club or district has planned that relate to the scholar's studies

Items required at time of district application (Fall 2010)

Proposed university in a Rotary Future Vision District

Proposed field of study within one of the six areas of

Rotary focus

Proposed degree and timeline

Estimated budget

Proposed humanitarian project in the host district

Complete information regarding:

Explain how the scholar's program of study relates to the selected area of focus.

Describe the educations and professional goals of the scholar and how the scholarship will help to advance these goals.

How will the scholar use his/her education to address a need on a long-term basis in his/her hosting and/or international sponsoring community(ies)?

### **The Rotary World Peace Scholarship 11-13**

offers 60 individuals committed to peace and conflict resolution the opportunity to earn a two-year master's level degree in international studies, peace studies and conflict resolution at one of the Rotary Center's University partners. Rotary has contracted with six institutions worldwide to provide this valuable training. Our district can submit nominees to Rotary International by July 1, 2010. Final awards will be announced by year-end. Deadline for completed applications to **local clubs is April 2, 2010.**

impact world peace and conflict resolution in a significant, positive fashion during their future careers

demonstrate a commitment to a career in peace and conflict resolution

excel academically in their selected programs, accept the academic counsel and advice of the Rotary Center director, and obtain a master's degree or certificate at the conclusion of their scholarship period

participate in an annual Rotary Center seminar

serve as ambassadors of goodwill

make formal and informal appearances before Rotary clubs and districts, school and civic orgs, etc.

participate in district, regional, and international Rotary events

maintain contact with The Rotary Foundation throughout their professional careers in order to advise and assist Rotary International and its member clubs in their efforts to contribute to world peace and understanding

help evaluate and promote the Rotary World Peace Scholarships program

accept assignments to a Rotary Center outside of their home countries
