MEETING NOTES Jan 11 by Loren Swanson

The meeting was called to order about 12:30 by President Art Anderson. David Kray served as the Greeter and led the pledge of allegiance. Jerry Showalter gave the invocation.

Horatio Goycoolea, our foreign exchange student from Chile, presented the club with \$590 that he raised with the Chilean meal he prepared. The money goes to PolioPlus.

Loren Swanson introduced the speaker for the day, Kristin Rau.

Kristen was a Rotary Ambassadorial Scholar to Tanzania and Uganda. She was planning on doing her studies at Dar es Salaam University. However, due to a student strike, the school was closed. While waiting for the school to open she helped with the Peoples Action against Poverty in Tanzania and visited Rotary projects in Nairobi, Kenya. Finally when it appeared that it would be some time before the school reopened, Kristin, on her own initiative, found another project to work on in the form of the Refugee Law Project in Uganda. There she helped Congolese Refugees as they moved into Uganda. They helped about 200,000 refugees. Many of them had experienced sex and gender-based violence. This work took place at Kya-kall Refugee Settlement. There were many NGO's and other governments providing aid including the United Nations.

In order to let us know more about Africa, Kristen showed slides and talked about several aspects of the African society including: Transportation, Shopping, Food, Dancing, Wildlife, Churches and the landscape differences. 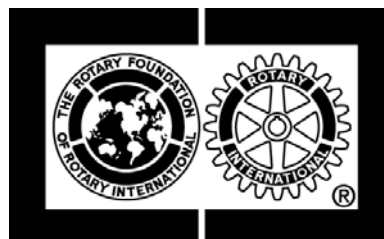
