June 14—The Alternative to Silence

Many people are affected by crime in such a way that makes it difficult for them to help solve the crime or come forward to talk to the Police. Crime Stoppers of Minnesota is a non profit organization that works to invite the public to help Law Enforcement solve crimes, capture fugitives and thus make safer communities. Bob Dennistoun, Executive Director, will explain the Crime Stoppers organization, its capabilities available to us as members of the community and how it is a resource for Law Enforcement to provide an Alternative to Silence in reporting information about crime.

Bob Dennistoun is an employee of Hannon Security Services, Inc a regional security company based in Bloomington, but 100% of his time is donated by Hannon Security to help Crime Stoppers of Minnesota where his job is as its Executive Director.

He grew up in Rosemount Minnesota, graduated from the University of Minnesota in Minneapolis and later earned an MBA from the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul. Prior to joining Crime Stoppers he was the General Manager of a 450 employee security staffing company serving customers in the five state area, and before that worked in the telecommunications and technology industry.

Loren Swanson. Wagner showed a DVD about working in Haiti. Salway followed up with a world-view of their work. The work is providing sustainable support to very challenged populations of disadvantaged countries. They represent “Compatible Technology International”.

CTI was founded here in St. Paul in 1981 by a group of food scientists, missionaries, and research engineers to address post-harvest handling of locally grown food. Most countries can grow food but much of it is lost due to inefficient processing and/or spoilage. They develop and supply processing equipment and know-how for the local people to handle the food. In some cases they provide recipes and procedures for nourishing foods to be packed and sent to the countries, in some cases they supply equipment and know-how, and in the best cases they supply designs and processing know-how for local manufacture of equipment. Salway used examples of handling beans, peanuts, pearl millet, and potatoes, all of which can be locally grown but must be processed and stored effectively to provide good food.

Salway is a “displaced” Brit who had a career in large business and then decided to “give back”. He said managing 170 independent minded volunteers is a real challenge. Wagner said she would set up a visit to their operations. We should hold her to that idea, it would be very interesting.
