who are looking for ways to get clear of their current debts and develop a plan for financial health.

Pat identified the many types of financial scams that are perpetrated on people who are financially vulnerable such as: foreclosure rescue, credit repair, debt settlements advance loan schemes and payday loans.

Many people know someone who may be in trouble and need help. There are a number of legitimate financial counseling services offered by non-profit agencies such as Lutheran Social Services available to help people gain control of their finances and achieve financial wellness.

LSS Financial Counseling is a nonprofit agency that served more than 21 thousand people in financial need in 2009. They have 10 locations around the state and in Superior, Wisconsin that offer in-person counseling. Individuals may opt for phone or Internet counseling and advice as well.

A certified counselor will sit down with an individual or couple and look over budgets and debt. The first hour session is free to everyone and, if it is determined that further resources or counseling is needed or desired, people can receive additional help with budget counseling, debt consolidation, foreclosure prevention, bankruptcy counseling and many other services for a small fee.
